Barry Hinson
Basketball

A 1983 graduate of Oklahoma State, Barry Hinson owns a 321-246 (.566) career record as the head coach at Oral Roberts (1997-99), Missouri State (1999-08) and Southern Illinois (2012-19). He also spent 4 seasons on Bill Self's staff at Kansas (2008-12). After 16 seasons and 155 league victories, Hinson was known as the Dean of the Missouri Valley Conference. Only Mr. Henry Iba (21 years, 190 wins), Eddie Hickey (20, 163) and Dana Altman (16, 178) coached more seasons or won more games as a head coach in the history of that league. In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hinson tallied 14 winning seasons, including 8 seasons with at least 19 wins, finished in the top 3 of his conference 9 times and advanced to the NIT on 4 occasions. Kris Cinkovich
Football

Coach Cinkovich is currently the director for the Las Vegas Nike Coach of the Year Football Clinic. He coached OC/OL at the University of Idaho from 2013-2021 and was on the staff that led Idaho to its only 3rd bowl win in the 128-year history of the school. Prior to Idaho, Kris coached WRs at the University of Arkansas, playing in both Sugar and Cotton Bowl games with the team ranked 5th in the nation at the end of 2011 season.

He also coached WR's at UNLV from 2004-2009, and was the head coach at Las Vegas High School from 1995-2003 where his Wildcats won the 2001 Nevada 4A State Title. Cinkovich played and coached at Carroll College for Bob Petrino Sr. Topic: "Tips to Improve as a Coach This Season and OL Drills."

Bobby Hauck
Football

Bobby Hauck is the winningest coach in Grizzly history, and recently became the winningest coach in Big Sky Conference history with 129 wins in his 13 years at the University of Montana. Hauck led the Grizzlies to seven-straight Big Sky Championships and three FCS National Championship Appearances between 2003 and 2009, with more wins than any other coach in FCS football. Since returning to Missoula in 2018 he's added 49 more wins, and in 2023 led UM to an 8th Big Sky title and 4th National Championship appearance. Heading into his 18th year overall as a college head coach, he's got the most wins of any active FCS coach this decade.



Matt Houk
Volleyball

Houk's first season at MSU was memorable, and now, entering his second season, the foundation for excellence is laid; a culture of grittiness, bravery, and resiliency has become the cornerstone for future success. Houk guided MT State to a 24-9 overall mark and a 12-4 Big Sky Conference ledger, both marks the best in Bobcat volleyball history. MSU finished 2nd in the league standings, its highest showing ever. With its successful 2023 resume, MSU played in its first postseason national tournament, advancing to the Fab Four with victories over Pacific, Sacramento State, and Wyoming, losing to eventual champion Wichita State in semi-final play. Houk's team ranked among the top 25 in the nation in total attacks (4,613), team kills (1,685), team service aces (220), and team assists (1,546). Sarah Walker
T&F

14-year coach, Sarah Walker, currently coaches T&F, VB and BB at Buffalo, WY, directs the Ironwood Throws Camp in Rathdrum, ID, and is the co-founder and Director of the 307 Throws Camp in Buffalo, WY. Before Buffalo, in Phoenix, she helped coach multiple shot and discus 5A state champs and placers. Sarah competed Post-Collegiate in the Shot on 2 World Championship Teams ('07, '11). She attended ASU where she was a 2x NCAA National Champ (Shot & Discus), 5x NCAA Runner-Up, and a 15x NCAA All-American. She scored over 101 NCAA Championship Meet Points, #2 all-time. Personal bests: Shot Put - 61' 7", Discus - 189' 5", Hammer 218' 3", Weight Throw - 71' 10". Sarah was part of 3 NCAA National T&F Championship teams at ASU. She was an 8x HS State Champion in SD and CO. Topics: "Glide Shot", "Rotational Shot" & "Discus"

Garvis holds a master's degree in educational leadership from Drake University & master's degree in sports management, and is certified by the NIAA as a certified master athletic administrator. He has been recognized by the NISACA as an "National Athletic Director of the Year Finalist". As a leader in the sports industry Garvis has presented to athletic administrators across the country and his ideas on athletic leadership have been published in numerous professional journals.

Garvis was a finalist for the 2014-15 NISACAAD of the Year. He was also named the 2015-16 Iowa High School Athletic Director Association Central Iowa Athletic Director of the Year as well as receiving the 2015-16 & 2017-18 NIAAA IHSADA Distinguished Service Award and received the 2016-17 IHSADA NFHS Citation Award.

Jace Henderson is Nebraska's women's basketball program director of player personnel, development, and influence. She served as a Montana assistant in 2020-21, after spending 2019-20 as a graduate assistant with the Lady Griz. As a basketball senior in 2018-19, Henderson earned second-team All-Big Sky honors by averaging 12.0 points, 8.6 rebounds and 3.7 assists and a Big Sky-best field goal 56.1% as a senior. Henderson was a 2x team MVP and a 3x Most Inspirational Player. Jace, daughter of former RMC Coach Brian Henerson, also had an outstanding career as a multi-sport athlete at Billings Senior leading her Volleyball Lady Broncs to back-to-back state titles as a junior and senior. She was also a 3x top-four thrower at the Class AA State T&F meet.



Marty Mornhinweg
Football

Marty Mornhinweg joined the Giz in 1980, after a record breaking career at Oak Grove HS in San Jose, CA. He led the 1981 Grizzlies to a 7-3 record. Next season they had their first Big Sky championship and the first playoff appearance in the school's history. Mornhinweg then was the training camp QB for the San Francisco 49ers and then played for the Denver Dynamite. Next to NAU where he coached RBs followed by 10 years coaching college football. In 1995, Mornhinweg moved to the NFL where he coached for 26 years. He has worked with some of the all-time greats including quarterbacks Brett Favre, Steve Young and Jeff Garcia; receivers Jerry Rice, Terrell Owens, and Desean Jackson; running backs Dorsey Levens, Garrison Hearst, Charlie Garner and many others. Marty has coached in 2 Super bowls, 6 Championship games and 5 Pro Bowls and was inducted into Oak Grove HOF, The UofM HOF and the MT Pro FB HOF.



Ross Walker
T&F

Ross has coached for 17 years, currently at Buffalo, WY. Before Buffalo, he coached multiple 5A state champions and placers in the shot put and discus in Arizona. In addition to coaching T&F, Ross is the FB DC at Buffalo, and also coaches basketball. He serves as the Glide Shot Put Event Coordinator for the Ironwood Throws Camp (Rathdrum, ID) and is a co-founder of the 307 Throws Camp in Buffalo, WY. Ross was a 2-Time NAIA National Champion and a 12-Time T&F NAIA All-American. Ross' personal bests are: Shot Put - 58' 8", Discus - 181' 6", Hammer - 196', Weight Throw - 63'. Britt Cooper Basketball

Cooper, a Harrison native, was named MT Western's 8th Head Women's Basketball Coach in 2023. Britt served as a Lady Bulldog 2022-23 assistant coach under Lindsay Woolley. Before returning to coach at Western, Britt was a graduate assistant for the NCAA Division II Angelo State women's basketball program for the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons. She then served a season as head Girls' BB Coach at Harrison High. Cooper was a standout player for Western's 2019 NAI National Championship team, earning the NAI tournament's hustle award. She was named all-conference twice for the Bulldogs, Honorable Mention All-America in 2019, and finished her career with 1085 points and 890 rebounds.



Jetton Ailes Basketball

Coach Ailes recently completed her 16th year coaching girls basketball at Billings Central—the past 9 years as head coach. In those 9 years her Rams have won 7 divisional trophies, including 5 divisional titles; qualified for the state tournament 7 times, placing as Co-champs in 2020; garnered 2nd place finishes in 2021 and 2022 and a State A Title along with MCA COY honors in 2024. Her overall coaching record is 165-43. Ailes graduated from Billings Senior and played college basketball at MSUB. Topic: Creating Healthy Competition Amongst Teammates.



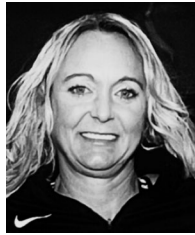
Randy Chase Basketball

Randy Chase is the head coach of the Skyview High School Girls Basketball Program. Under his leadership, the Falcons soared to a flawless 24-0 season, clinching the State AA Girls Basketball Championship this past season. Honored twice as the MCAA AA Basketball COY, Chase's expertise spans 28 years of coaching in Billings as a head coach or assistant for various programs. Eric Holbrook Basketball

Eric Holbrook just finished his 2nd season at Dawson with a combined record of 59-15 (77%). He spent the previous 2 years at Dickinson State as an assistant, head JV coach. Before Dickinson, Holbrook spent 4 seasons as an assistant coach for Spokane CC where he helped lead the program to 77 wins, a trip to the NWAC Championship tournament each year with one 3rd and one 5th place finish. Holbrook played for Spokane CC as a 2-year starter. Eric went onto play at NCAA D2 Western Oregon. In high school, his Priest River Lamanna High team won an Idaho state championship. Cortnee Gunlock Basketball

Cortnee Gunlock has been the Bigfork Valkyries' head girls basketball coach for the past 5 seasons, with her Valkyries achieving a 98-21 win-loss record, a 2022 Class B Girls 3rd Place finish, a 2023 Class B 1st Place finish, and a 2024 Class A 2nd Place finish. Cortnee played intercollegiate basketball at Carroll College and was an assistant coach for eight seasons before taking over at Bigfork. She has a Doctorate in physical therapy from Pacific University and a BS in chemistry from Carroll College. She has extensive experience specializing in physical therapy, intramuscular stimulation, and rehabilitative medicine. Topic: "Sports Performance".



Mark Harkins Basketball

Coach Harkins has just finished his 33rd year as an educator and coach, retiring at the end of this school year to spend time with his wife, Christy, and their growing family. For the past 17 years, since its opening in 2007, Coach Harkins has been the only head boys basketball coach at Glacier High School. In those years, Glacier has qualified for the state AA tournament 11 times, winning the championship in 2017, and taking 3rd in 2023. Topic: "Coaching a HS Multiple Defensive System".



Jeff Hays Basketball

Hays recently finished his 14th year as the head boys basketball coach at Hellgate in Missoula. In 12 of the 14 seasons Hellgate has finished in the top 2 of the Western AA Conference with 7 regular season championships. Hellgate has also placed at the State Tournament 9 times, including 3 Championships and 2 runners-up. Hays' career record at Hellgate is 254-68. Hays graduated from Hellgate and finished his playing career at Carroll College. Topic: "Developing Tough Players & Teams".



Scott Sparks Basketball

Coach Sparks has been a head boys basketball coach in Montana for the past 22 years, the last 9 at Fergus High School and 13 years in Denton. His Fergus teams have played for the last three Class "A" state titles, winning the 2023 championship. Coach Sparks has coached Legion baseball for the past 24 years and coached high school football in Denton for 11 years. Over three sports his teams have won almost 1300 games and have advanced to 11 state title games, winning 4 state titles. He's a 4-time MCA Coach of the Year, and an 8-time nominee. Topic: "Defensive Concepts, Drills, and Schemes".



Jeff Edwards Basketball

Jeff graduated from Columbus HS in 2004, where he played for HOF coach Paul Barta. In 2010, Jeff began his coaching career at Beaverhead County High School as an assistant coach for the girls' basketball team. In 2013, Jeff moved to the boy's program where he would assist HOF coach Terry Thomas for 10 seasons. During that time, Dillon won 2 state championships and were runners-up 4 other times. When Coach Thomas retired after the 2022-23 season, Jeff was hired. During his inaugural season the Dillon Beavers captured the 2023-24 Class A state championship. Grady Bennett FB, T&F

Coach Bennett graduated from Flathead in 1986 where he was a three sport, 1st-team all-state athlete. He then started at QB for three seasons for the Grizzlies 1988-1990. After a tryout with the BC Lions, he started his teaching and coaching career back at his alma mater. Following 13 seasons as an assistant, Bennett stepped in as Braves head FB coach for three seasons 2004-2006. When Glacier opened in 2007, he moved to become the first and only head FB coach in the school's 17 year history. After 33 years of coaching FB, 21 years of BB and now 2 at T&F, Grady looks to share his passion and tips he has learned. Derek Gackle Football

Derek Gackle, a Circle native is in his 12th year coaching at Fairview; 5th as the head coach with a record of 33-10, culminating with the State Title in 2023. His high school tenure started with 4 years in Columbus. He then spent 4 years in Hardin compiling an overall record of 21-10 as the head coach. He coached college football for 7 years with stops at Valley City State, SD School of Mines, and Northern State in Aberdeen, SD. He also played/coached in Denmark. Derek was an all-conference player for Minot State. Topic: "What We Do"



Jeremy MacDonald Basketball

Coach MacDonald has been the Box Elder Boys BB Coach for 11 years, in two stints (2012-17 and 2020-24). MacDonald was a 6x District 9C COY in '13, '16, '23 and '24. Box Elder has won six 9C Conference Championships, seven 9C District Tournament Championships, three Northern C Divisional Championships, and three State C Championships in '14, '16, '24. Jeremy is a Box Elder, UM and Arizona State grad. He has been principal or superintendent at Box Elder for 10 years. Topic: "Uptempo BB"



Ryan Nourse Football

Libby native Ryan Nourse begins his 10th season at Montana Western. He is the winningest coach in UMW history with an all-time 45-41 (.523). In 2023 the Bulldogs won the Frontier Conference Championship, led the Frontier with 7 First Team All-Conference Selections, the Offensive Player of the Year, 3 All American Selections and 2 Academic All-Americans. The Bulldogs were #1 in Total Offense in the Frontier Conference for the 4th consecutive year and the Bulldogs QB won the OPOY for the 3rd consecutive season. Nourse was named the 2023 Frontier Conference COY. His Bulldogs won the Frontier Conference Championship in 2021 and 2023. Topic: "Coaching Tips and Reminders for Fall Camp"



Travis Dean Football

Travis Dean enters his 5th season with Coach Kyle Samson and the Oredigger staff as OC and RB/TE. Prior to Tech, Dean was the Running Backs Coach at Flathead under Kyle Samson. The Braves boasted the top offense in the AA and made it to the State Championship game in 2018. Dean coached 1 year at Havre High School as OC and QB Coach. Earlier Travis played for Mark Samson at MSU-Northern and was the quarterback for their explosive offense that ranked in the top of the NAI in Total Yards and Completion Percentage. Topic: "OC"



Brian Davison Football – 6-Man

Brian has been the head football coach at Centerville for the past 9 years with his Miners finishing the 2023 season as Class C 6-Man State Champs. He also coached the girls basketball team for 3 years before taking over the boys basketball program for the past 4 years. Davison's first 5 years of football were spent coaching 8-man and the last 4 years have been in 6-man. Brian played high school football at Highwood under Mike Nelson and won 3 straight state championships Topic: "6-Man Offense"



Robert Boyle Football

Boyle is entering his 11th season at Bozeman HS where he as the OC and QB coach the past 4 years. Earlier, he coached the receivers for 6 years. Topic: "Preparing as an OC while empowering the QB, and developing the passing game to have multiple answers".



Hunter Chandler Football

Hunter Chandler is in his 4th year as the head football coach at Gallatin HS where his teams reached the semifinals in '22 & '23. Previously, he served 5 years as Bozeman's DC & assistant coach. Chandler started his coaching career under Mark Samson at Havre. Topic: "Keys to a Winning Defense".



Tucker Yates Football

In 2020, Yates was hired as Gallatin High's DL coach and in 2024 he was promoted to the DC. At MSU, 2014-18, Yates was one of the most outstanding DL in the Big Sky Conference, garnering Co-Defensive MVP in 2017. At Colstrip, Tucker was a 3x All-State O & D-Line selection, won 3 State B Wrestling Titles and was a 2-time State B Shot Champion. Topic: "D-Line Fundamentals and Drills".



Charlie Brown Football

Charlie Brown was a longtime assistant football coach at Fairfield, under Les Meyer. Charlie coached the O&D lines. The Eagles won 3 State Championships and played in 9 chippers. The Eagles overall record was 189-58 with a 54-game conference win streak. Charlie was 2021 MCAA Assistant COY and 2023 NHSACA Assistant COY Finalist. Topic: "Offensive Line Play"



Alan Cress T&F

Alan Cress begins his 12th year as an assistant for the Argo T&F teams. Cress has revolutionized the Argos' throwing program with his athletes setting, and resetting every school throws record. At Providence, 39 of his throwers have qualified for NAIA National T&F Championships, with 4 reaching All-American honors. In the last 3 years Cress has mentored 9 individual FC Champs and 31 all-conference performances. Prior to coaching college, Cress was an assistant HS T&F coach, mentoring 6 state champs, and 16 top-6 state finishers. Cress lettered 3-years in T&F and 2 years in FB at Emporia State in KS. Mike Krings T&F

Mike Krings has coached pole vault and jumps at Conrad High School since 2021. He has coached 4 Class-B state PV champions combined between boys and girls in 3 seasons coaching, as well as coached a Class-B girls record. Mike vaulted for Eastern Washington and North Dakota State, finishing his career on the top ten performance lists at both schools, and as a Big Sky Conference outdoor runner-up in 2005. Mike is a Montana Game Warden Sergeant by profession, with 10 years of experience coaching and training law enforcement officers. Topics: "PV-Runway Speed and Form; Drills to focus on improving specific areas of the vault".



Dan Nile T&F

Dan Nile has been the Head Track Coach at Missoula Big Sky for 23 years preceded by 11 years as head T&F at Arlee. Coach Nile has won 3 State titles at Big Sky along with 17 career state trophies. He has coached all events in his career, bringing a wide variety of experience. He has coached 160 state placers and more than 40 State Champions. Nile is a 2017 MCA HOF Inductee. Topic: "Sprints and Relays"



Jesse Zentz T&F

Coach Jesse Zentz enters his 5th season at Helena High as both the head girls XC coach and head girls T&F coach/distance coach, leading the track team to state titles in 2021 and 2023, and 2nd place in 2022. Earlier, Zentz served as assistant boys and girls XC and distance coach for five years. He has directly coached athletes to nine individual state titles; girls school records in the 200, 400, 800, 1600, and 3200; and boys school records in the 800 and 1600. Zentz ran for Billings West and the University of Montana. Topics: "Middle Distance - Coaching the 400-800 athlete" and "Coaching the 800-3200 athlete".



Heather Lewis T&F

Heather Lewis began her coaching career at Cascade High School in 2019 under Coach Christa Hardy, focusing on throws. By 2021, with the team's growth and new coaching staff, Heather expanded to horizontal jumps. Having coached a 2x state champion triple jumper and other talented athletes, Lewis's philosophy emphasizes inspiring athletes, nurturing their skills, and fostering growth both on and off the track. A 2001 Great Falls High grad, Heater has specialized in varsity shot and discus for 3 years. Topics: "Long Jump" and "Triple Jump"



Anders Brooker Cross Country

Anders Brooker is the head Hellgate High School XC coach and also serves as distance coach for the track team. His Hellgate Knights have state titles in 2007 and 2021 and his Lady Knights were 2022 and 2023 State Champs. Brooker is a 5-time MCA Coach of the Year and an 8-time nominee. Anders is also owner of "The Runner's Edge" and a steadfast Montana running community leader. Topic: "2 XC sessions and one for T&F distance"

Moe Boyle Volleyball

Moe Boyle became the head coach of the Fighting Saints Volleyball team in 2005. In 18 seasons, her volleyball program has accumulated a 305-221 record, making it to the NAIA Regional Tournament in both 2005 and 2006 and the national tournament in 2012 and 2016. In 2019, they went 16-13, with a trip to the Frontier Conference Tournament semifinals. Prior to Carroll, Coach Boyle spent 10 years in the Montana high school ranks, with 5 years each at Helena Capital and Flathead. Topic: "Serve-Receive Drills"



Erika Gustavsen Volleyball

Erika Gustavsen, now at Gallatin High, has coached 18 years in Montana. She was a head girls' BB coach for 7 seasons, and 7 years as head VB coach. Erika spent 4 seasons as the head VB coach at Bozeman High, and she is currently in her 3rd season as the head VB coach at Gallatin. Her teams have made the AA state tourney every season, winning a state championship in '15 and placing 3rd in '14 and '23. She has a 135-36 record and was selected as MCA COY in 2015-16 for volleyball and girls basketball. This is Erika's 3rd time speaking at the clinic. Aubrey Beaumont Volleyball

Beaumont joined RMC as head VB coach in January 2024. A GFHS graduate, Beaumont recently served as the head coach at Lindsey Wilson College in KY, leading the Blue Raiders to a 19-15 record and runners-up in the Mid-South Conference Tournament Championship. Aubrey was a grad assistant for 2 seasons at Jamestown, followed by 2 seasons as assistant at McPherson College. Aubrey played at Jamestown, contributing to two trips to the national tournament as a setter. Overall, Beaumont has made 6 trips to the NAIA Tournament as a player and coach. Iona Stookey Volleyball

Iona Stookey has coached in MT 38 years, 34 as the head VB coach at Huntley Project. Her Lady Red Devils have won 19 District titles, 19 Divisional titles, and 15 State Championships along with 960 career wins. Iona is a 15x MCA COY, a 5x National COY finalist and was the 2020-21 National Federation HS VB COY. Iona was also selected as the AVCA Region 11 COY in '23 and the '10 Big Sky State Games National Female "Athlete of the Year". Tyson Anderson Softball

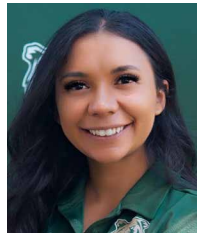
